### **Next Steps:**

1. Develop options for setting out different jurisdictions of the national SX Government;
2. Gain clarity on the Starter Kit of Laws and Policies and identify priorities;
3. Develop Preamble to the Agreement-in-Principle (AiP);
4. Review the draft Constitution and revise, as necessary;
5. Review current educational materials (DVDs, etc.) and develop culturally-based Treaty information sessions and events;
6. Improve communications, including:
  - a. Review/revise the message being communicated to community members to make it about Treaty being the way to preserve our rights;
  - b. Develop a social media campaign with a dedicated full-time staff person;
  - c. Run an ongoing myth-busting campaign;
  - d. Explore the option of having a leadership-led communication channel (e.g. podcast or radio broadcast)
7. Define the role of Elders in Treaty;
8. Define goals for self-governance;
9. Update governance structure to include local First Nation / village political structure;
10. Develop a transition plan to move from the Indian Act to Treaty.

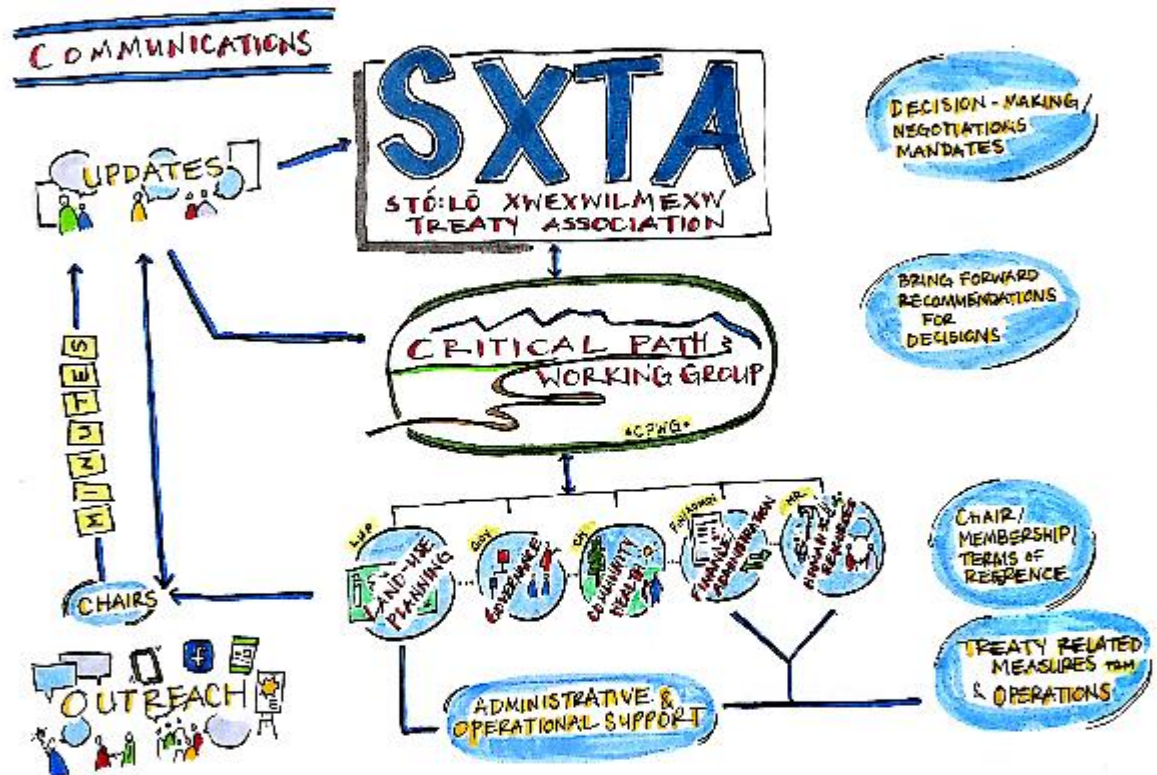
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
